Roger Duke, PMP BNG America

"Marketing a Difference"

Roger, a certified project manager, implemented a community outreach initiative with the SR Chapter of Project Management Institute. The objective was to help nonprofits complete challenging projects by capitalizing on the chapter's expertise in project management. Roger will share his experiences on two projects; the Imperial Theatre Marquee and the James Brown Statue Cam and how organizations, like PMI and AACE can market themselves in the community by helping nonprofits.

Roger Duke began his career at Savannah River Site in 1977 as a Project Engineer. During his 31 years at SRS, he mostly held positions in project and program management. Four years ago, his company, BNFL, changed its name to BNG America. Roger was responsible for developing and implementing a branding campaign in the

Augusta area. BNG America was later acquired by EnergySolutions and Roger continued the campaign, but now for EnergySolutions.

As part of the marketing strategy, Roger became heavily involved with nonprofit organizations by being on their boards and also volunteering for special events. He quickly discovered that nonprofits are great at coming up with plans, but generally have trouble executing them.

Highlights from the 4/24/08 Dinner Meeting



Our May Section Dinner Meeting featured guest speaker Therese Rosier, Assistant Vice President of Plant Operations, Augusta State University (ASU). The recent completion of the Augusta State University's new amphitheatre, providing outdoor seating and spacious tiered grassy areas for approximately 550, is just one of the many facility upgrades and renovations underway at the Augusta State University in Augusta. Other facility changes include the construction of a \$11M Student Activities Center, \$4.4M project to improve the storm water retention system, \$2.8M central energy project to provide additional chillers, boiler, cooling tower and several offices, and renovations to several existing structures on the campus.

Situated on "the hill" of Augusta, Georgia, ASU has concentrated its efforts in master planning to preserve and make the best use of the historic buildings of the former Augusta Arsenal. Many of the University's stately buildings date back to the founding of the arsenal in the 1820's. Preservation of historic sites, legacy infrastructure issues, combined with the construction of new, modern facilities, creates a constant demand, and ever shifting priorities in allocation of the University's resources. Ms. Rosier spent the evening sharing many interesting historical facts, before and after photos, and design and construction stories.

We also had the honor of hosting AACEI President Bill Krause. Bill joined the Section Board for a special meeting following the Dinner Presentation.
